We currently do not own the materials necessary for testing here at the College of Notre Dame. If you need to be assessed for a possible learning disability, you need to set up an appointment with an appropriately trained professional. A list of providers is listed below. Assessment can be *expensive, so it's important to inquire about fees before making your appointment. You may ask if the testing agency offers "sliding scale" fees if you family budget can't accommodate the standard fee. You may wish to contact your insurance company to see if they offer assistance in paying for psychological or neuropsychological evaluations—some policies may help with costs but others do not.
